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



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Project goals

- To improve cancer survivor health and well being through addressing structural inequities and racism
 - Improve clinical-community linkages
 - Employ Community Health Workers to facilitate connections between healthcare settings and community supports
 - Deliver anti-racism training within and across healthcare settings



R4P: A Health Equity Framework for Research Planning and Evaluation in African American Populations

- **Remove**: Intentionally looking for where racism can show up in the research design or intervention
- **Repair**: Consider the past injustices and trauma caused by research with the target audience to repair the damage done to university/community partnership and regain trust by community members in research
- **Restructure**: Analyzing the research and PAB structures to assess how to restructure policies, expectations, or traditions that will further marginalize historically excluded groups
- Remediate: Lowering the inconveniences or risks associated with research structures and processes
- **Provide**: Providing capability building and/or resources in ways that are accessible and equitable
